Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

Upon completion of the course the student should have the ability to:

Knowledge and understanding

- describe and discuss the concepts co-production, inclusive research, participatory research and co-creation
- describe and discuss the process when implementing inclusive research in a research project
- describe and discuss the benefits when using co-production and inclusive research in projects.

Skills and abilities

- design a research-project together with participants/end-users
- prepare presentations of results adapted to participants and specific target-groups
- adapt mechanisms that make co-production and inclusive research to be applicable in practice.

Judgement and approach

- consider ethical and cultural aspects and evaluate how this will apply when adopting inclusive research in the own project
- consider sustainability related to the own project and progression of the research.

Contents

- tools to implement co-production and inclusive research
- mechanisms to facilitate co-production and inclusive research
- ethical considerations related to co-production and inclusive research

Type of instruction

The course is a web-based course with two campus-meetings and consists of lectures, discussion

seminars and a workshop.

The teaching is conducted in English.

Prerequisites

Entry requires 240 credits of which 60 credits should be on advanced level, including thesis of 15 credits (or equivalent).
